

On this Saturday, April 27th, Coffee and refreshments will be provided before a short business meeting at 9:30, and a presentation by our guest speaker, Paul Colburn, Master Wildlife Conservationist. The topic of his presentation is “Black Bears in Connecticut”. Mr. Colburn will focus on the natural history of black bears in Connecticut, an overview of black bear habitat, diet, behavior, and reproduction, as well as current research efforts. He will provide practical recommendations for optimum coexistence with our black bear population; an important topic for land trust properties and neighboring landowners, as black bears re-establish their range in many of the towns in The Middlesex Land Trust’s service area.

Bring your hiking shoes! After the meeting at the deKoven House, we will be heading out to enjoy the land we work so hard to protect. Join us on a hike at Sellow Preserve in East Hampton at noon.



Stewardship Update

Land conservation doesn't end once the land is protected by the Land Trust. Stewardship - otherwise known as active land management - ensures that preserved lands remain healthy and ecologically significant for future generations. Ongoing stewardship efforts by the Middlesex Land Trust's all volunteer stewardship committee and stewardship volunteers include: clearing

and marking trails, mowing meadows and parking areas, removing invasive plants and re-planting with native species, conducting biological inventories, repairing and constructing fencing, and much more.

2019 Hike Schedule with John LeShane

Join us for a hike this year with John LeShane at one of our beautiful preserves that you have helped to protect! There is a hike scheduled every month in 2019 from April through November!

All of our 2019 hikes will be held on Saturdays and begin at 10:00 a.m. with the exception of our April 27th hike after our Annual Meeting, which will begin at noon. The following hikes are currently scheduled:

April 27th at Noon: Sellew Preserve, East Hampton
May 25th at 10:00 a.m.: Mica Ledges Preserve, Durham & Madison
June 29th at 10:00 a.m.: Palmer-Taylor Preserve, Portland
July 27th at 10:00 a.m.: Abe Temkin Preserve, Portland
August 31st at 10:00 a.m.: Highland Pond Preserve, Middletown
September 28th at 10:00 a.m.: Oak Ledges Preserve, Portland
October 26th at 10:00 a.m.: Lower Pine Brook Preserve, East Hampton
November 30th at 10:00 a.m.: Brainerd Quarry Preserve, Haddam Neck

Although conditions vary for each hike, the following information is relevant for most of our activities and hikes:

Participants should wear sturdy shoes or sneakers and bring snacks and water as desired. Steady rain or snow will cause us to cancel an event - check our Facebook page or website for updates. These hikes are between 2 to 4 miles.
